Hand to Hand Grants over \$32,000

Hand to Hand, a women's giving circle at CCF, awarded four grants to nonprofits serving San Diego County. *Hand to Hand makes an impact in the lives of women and girls in San Diego County by directing resources to programs that empower change and self-sufficiency.* 2016 grantees were:

- **Generate Hope** (\$10,000) for a residential treatment program for victims of sex trafficking
- **Karen Organization of San Diego** (\$5,700) to fund women's mentoring circles for Burmese refugees in San Diego
- **Kitchens for Good** (\$10,000) for culinary job training and life skills program for women in need
- **New Entra Casa** (\$6,500) to support the residential treatment program for women being released from prison



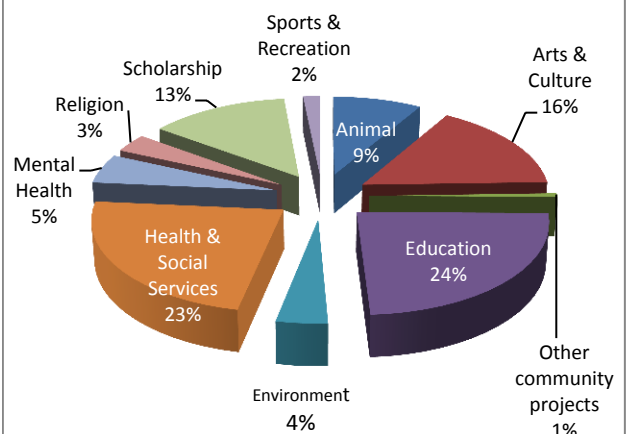

2016 Grantmaking

Coastal Community Foundation granted \$300,000 to a wide variety of nonprofits, schools and community programs. Over \$71,000 in education grants were made to North County Schools for art, science and creative programs. Twenty-eight students received scholarships. Over \$47,000 funded numerous arts and cultural programs in the County; \$25,000 supported programs to help animals. Donor advised fund grants made an impact locally, regionally and nationally.

Murray Galinson San Diego-Israel Initiative

In partnership with a growing consortium of funders that care about multi-faceted education about Israel, the Leichtag Foundation launched a new collaborative – the Murray Galinson San Diego-Israel Initiative. The goal of the Initiative is to promote and support knowledge, discourse and interaction of the modern state of Israel through scholarship, engagement and collaboration. The Initiative partners with universities in San Diego and Israel, local law schools, the Israel Initiative based in Washington DC and Tel Aviv and others. Upcoming projects include an Israeli film and television symposium, San Diego student participation in international academic competitions in Israel, a water-recycling workshop with Hebrew University students and UCSD students.
