Solana Beach Fund Grants \$15,000 To Three Programs

Casa de Amistad

PEP! is a pilot program focused on low-income, local preschool students. It is conducted two days per week for two hours by licensed preschool instructors in a single classroom. A welcoming, beautiful environment energizes and motivates them with proven strategies, helping participants gain critical pre-kindergarten skills. These underserved children will build self-confidence and will be ready to start school successfully. Without PEP!,



these children would likely suffer a severe academic achievement gap before they begin elementary school. Casa de Amistad is working collaboratively on this project with the Solana Beach School District, Head Start, and the Solana Beach Presbyterian Church.

La Colonia de Eden Gardens

La Colonia de Eden Gardens Foundation will sponsor The Youth Summer Leadership Camp 2015 at Whispering Winds Conference Center in the Cuyamaca Mountains near Julian. Approximately 60 teens will attend, accompanied by 12 adult volunteer counselors. Presentations will be led by MiraCosta College as well as San Diego County Office of Education staff and partners from MADD and the San Dieguito Alliance for Drug Free youth. Activities will include swimming, hiking, zip line, archery, camp fires, talent shows, and team building. Students will come back from the leadership camp energized eager to "give back" to and be involved in their community.



Trauma Intervention Program

The TIP program provides public health care services to Solana Beach residents. While the public safety system has been traditionally efficient, the addition of TIP volunteers offers a human dimension enabling it to provide what many emergency scenes need: compassionate support. After a crisis, a person may feel alone, confused and may not be able to function normally. By providing TIP services, citizens obtain a chance for increased mental health care and decreased likelihood of severe post-traumatic stress symptoms. With the presence of TIP, the individual receives guidance to begin the grieving and healing process easily and accessibly.
