Coastal Community Foundation SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS AND SELECTION CRITERIA

No members of the families of the Scholarship Committee, or employees of the Foundation, shall be eligible for any scholarship. Scholarship awards range from \$500 - \$3,000.

The Foundation will not be under obligation to distribute funds if no suitable candidates are found in a given period of time. All scholarship awards will be granted to the college or university by December 2022.

Application Instructions & Check List

Review the criteria for each scholarship. Some scholarships are only available to graduating seniors from specific high schools or school districts. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

 Complete all sections of the application and submit on the CCF website.

Submit <u>one</u> letter of recommendation. Recommenders should email letters directly.
Appropriate recommenders include: student's high school teacher, counselor, coach, school administrator, employer, or staff where student volunteers or interns.
2. Submit transcripts for Chavez and Hall applications only. Unofficial copies are accepted.
_ If under age 18, make sure the application is signed by a parent or guardian.
Please do not submit personal financial information or tax returns.
_ Applications and supplementary materials must be received electronically by April 1, 2022.

Scholarship Criteria by Scholarship

Bill Berrier Scholarship Fund

- 1. Scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors who plan to prepare for a professional career in the **field of education (teacher, counselor)**.
- 2. Graduating seniors who are attending one of the **San Dieguito Union High School District** schools are eligible to apply.
- 3. Students must have a minimum 3.0 grade point average.
- 4. Financial need will be considered.
- 5. This scholarship is eligible for renewal for up to 3 years. Requires satisfactory completion of full time course work, maintaining a minimum of 2.75 grade point average (4.0 scale) and continued pursuit of a career in the field of education.

Joe W. Chavez Educational Fund

- 1. Scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors who will be *pursuing a career* in the fields of medicine or government.
- 2. Students from Carlsbad, Oceanside and San Dieguito High School District are eligible for this scholarship in 2020. One to two scholarships will be made in each district. One to two scholarships will be made per district. The average scholarship range is \$1,000-1,500.
- 3. Students must have a **minimum 3.0 grade point average**. Please submit a **copy of transcripts** to: scholarships@coastalfoundation.org. (Unofficial copies are accepted.)
- 4. The scholarship is not need based. Awards will be made to students whose grades and personal activities demonstrate an ability to achieve their goals.

Joe DeCamp Memorial STEM Scholarship

- 1. Scholarships will be awarded to college-bound graduating high school seniors.
- 2. Applicant must be a direct admit to a Flagship University School's College of Engineering or admit to a school predominantly focused on graduating STEM majors.
- 3. Graduating seniors who reside in **Encinitas, Carlsbad, Oceanside, San Marcos** and **Vista** are eligible to apply.
- 4. Applicant must meet the minimum requirement for admission to the California State University system.
- 5. Preference will be given to students who are active with Boy Scout Troop #750.
- 6. This scholarship is merit based. Financial need is not considered.

Recommendation may come from Scout Leader in addition to options listed in guidelines.

Eric Hall Scholarship Fund

- 1. Students from Carlsbad, Oceanside San Dieguito, San Marcos, and Vista High School Districts are eligible for this scholarship.
- 2. Scholarships will be awarded to students pursuing a degree in the areas of architecture; civil or structural engineering; construction management or those interested in urban & city planning or public administration.
- 3. Please submit a **copy of transcripts** to: scholarships@coastalfoundation.org. (Unofficial copies are accepted.)
- 4. Applicants will be judged on the following:
 - a. Financial need
 - b. Experience in Community Service
 - c. Potential to succeed
 - d. Scholastic achievement, minimum 3.0 grade point average

Eric Scott Langdon and Diana Monzeglio Memorial Scholarship Fund for Artists

- 1. Scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors who will be studying **the arts**, **music or dance** at a college or university.
- 2. Students from San Dieguito Academy and Canyon Crest Academy *only* are eligible for this scholarship.
- 3. Preference will be given to students who excel in fine arts, dance, or music.
- 4. Preference will be given to students who need financial support to attend college.
- 5. Students must have a minimum **3.0 grade point average**.

Jackie Harrigan Haase Memorial Scholarship Fund

- 1. Scholarships will be awarded to students who are pursuing a career in nursing, counseling, psychology or special education.
- 2. Students from the San Dieguito Union High School District are eligible.
- 3. Students must be attending a two or four year college or university.
- 4. Students must have a minimum 3.0 grade point average.
- 5. Preference will be given to students who have been in special education.

Steve Pratt Refuse to Lose Scholarship Fund

- 1. Scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors who participate in a varsity sport and who plan to attend a 4-year college or university.
- 2. Graduating seniors who attend **Scripps Ranch High School** are eligible to apply.
- 3. Applicants must have a minimum 3.5 unweighted grade point average.
- 4. Financial need is not required, but may be considered.
